May 2020—Message from Fr. Dennis

It has been a long time since we have been together in person as a family. I know many of you have struggled physically, emotionally, and financially over the past several weeks. Know that my prayers are with you.

We have prepared a roadmap to reopening as we wait in hope for the time we can once again celebrate Mass together. We will comply with the directives from the archdiocese as they pertain to our parish and church configuration. Below are some questions you might be asking, and the information that we are able to share with you as of today.

When will we be able to attend Mass?

The Archbishop has indicated May 30/31 as the first weekend public Masses can be held, but keep in mind this is a fluid situation.

How will you ensure a safe and sanitary environment?

In compliance with the Archbishop's directives:


- Hand sanitizer will be available at key locations.
- We will sanitize pews and public areas frequently touched after weekend Masses.

How will the Mass experience be different?

 You will be seated by a hospitality minister by rows, without choice of pew or seating location. To maintain physical distancing, every other pew will be used, along with spacing between families in each pew.



ROADMAP TO REOPENING CONTINUED



The obligation to attend Mass is suspended until at least July 5, 2020.

- We will either not have Orders of Worship, or provide a one-time use single sheet aid. All other items will be removed from the pews.
- Holy Water fonts, including the Baptismal font, will remain empty.

As a parishioner, how can I help?

- Do not attend Mass if you feel ill or are uncomfortable attending.
- Stay home if you are over 70 or have a compromised immune system.
- White onsite, keep a 6 foot distance between you and others not in your immediate family.
- Wear a face mask if you are comfortable doing so.
- Follow all instructions given by the Hospitality Ministers.

How long will you continue to provide online Masses and ministry?

Minimally, we will continue to provide online Masses and ministry as long as the obligation to attend Mass is suspended. However, we envision continuing beyond that date if we have the resources and funding to do so.

ATTENDANCE

Our goal is to have any one who wishes to attend Mass be able to do so. We will continue to evaluate our attendance numbers and options each week.

What have you already done to clean and sanitize our facilities?

- The fabric in all the pews have been steam cleaned.
- All carpets and tile floors in the church have been steamed cleaned.
- The school classrooms have been cleaned and disinfected.
